We continue to see growth in many sectors in Dunedin but this growth is primarily being driven by the construction and tourism sectors. One of the biggest trends impacting employers in 2017 is the shortage of highly-skilled and experienced candidates with the construction sector being one of the heaviest hit by skills shortage not only in Dunedin but across New Zealand. The continued development of Christchurch and the Kaikoura earthquakes have taken a number of highly skilled workers across civil engineering, construction and many trade professionals.

The overall shortage of highly-skilled professionals will see Dunedin and New Zealand struggle to keep pace with Labour demands and we always welcome candidate referrals from our loyal candidates and clients to ensure 'Millennials' continue to put pressure on to drive workplace flexibility as their work-life balance expectations will continue to increase such as working from home and to have greater flexibility around their working hours.

HEALTH AND SAFETY - GOING ON A ROAD TRIP THIS EASTER?

If you are planning to drive this Easter, accept the fact that there will most likely be hold-ups along the way and allow extra travelling time. It is also particularly important to be patient, especially when following vehicles.

CHECK YOUR CAR - SAFETY BASICS

TYRES

- Check the tread depth. Minimum depth is 1.5mm, but the more tread you have the better the grip
- Check the tyre pressue if unsure check with the local garage
- Look for sharp objects in the tyres look for bubbles or cracks at the side

WINDSCREEN, WIPERS AND MIRRORS

- · Check your wiper blades for wear and tear
- Clean your mirrors and windscreen inside and out
- Get your windscreen fixed if it is chipped or cracked
- Check your windscreen washer fluid is full and working

INDICATORS

 Turn your hazard lights on and walk around the car - check all indicators are flashing.

LIGHTS

- Check lenses are clean and not cracked or hazy.
- Check your headlights, reversing lights and brake lights are working.

IMPORTANT REMINDERS TO ALL TEMPS

- To ensure you are paid on time you must have an accurate & signed (by your site supervisor) timesheet to Select by 9.00am each Monday.
